Marquette, Green Lake follow their own map

After 150 years, officials in Marquette and Green Lake counties are trying to un-straighten the record

Since 1858, the two counties have been ignoring boundaries defined by Wisconsin state statute, and instead have used a map that was, for some long-forgotten reason, different from the official description on the books in Madison

The 890 acres (32 land parcels in one woody, residential chunk and one small swamp) in question technically belong to Green Lake Connty, but for a century and a half, the dozen people living in the boundary lands have considered themselves - and have paid taxes as - Marquette Connty residents. And although both counties have decided to keep the land (and tax dollars) in Marquette County, the discrepancy sheds light on a period of history when rural Wisconsin counties quickly grew and reformed as frontier gave way to farming and civilization.

From 1836 to 1858, Wisconsin county boundaries were ever-shifting as settlers transformed the wilderness from untamed territory into villages and towns. In that period, Marquette County boundaries changed seven times, according to "Origin and Legislative History of County Boundaries in Wisconsin," a book produced by the Wisconsin Historical Records Survey in the 1940s that resides in the office of Jerry Smart, Marquette County surveyor

An act of territorial legislation in 1836 formed Marquette County from a chunk of Brown County, Smart said, From Marquette County's former mass of woods and rivers, the state Legislature broke off pieces to form Waushara County (1851) and Green Lake County (1858), which brought Marquette County to its current size of about 300,000 acres. Almost.

Both Marquette County and Green Lake County based their boundaries on a map showing the 890 acres as part of Marquette, while the state statute, which uses language illegible to the untrained reader known as "the rectangular system," says the two swatches of swamp and forest belong to the neighboring eastern county.

"For whatever reason it never got communicated to the state," Smart said. "I'm not terribly surprised, especially with how many changes were made."

The lost 890 acres was rediscovered by Green Lake global information systems specialist Gerald Stanuch while the mapmaker was investigating swamps on the county's western boarder. He was researching parcels of land with contested marshes, and he discovered something curious, some marsh land in Green Lake County was being taxed by Marquette County.

But as Stanuch dug deeper into the counties' zoning documents, he realized he was one in a long line of public servants puzzled by the questionable boundary land.

"I didn't think anyone's ever read the state statutes about the county," he said. "I discovered we still have records going back to the '70s." And the state's records go much further back.

A letter from 1979 describes how county representatives discussed fixing the state statute to reflect the "de facto situation that developed some time ago in disregard of the legal boundary description," which means that people living in the boundary land considered themselves Marquette County residents, even if the state didn't

Antique legislative summaries, maintained in a state database, show that locals living in the region during the Civil War wanted to keep their land as part of Marquette County.

Summanes show that the state's boundary statute was disregarded in 1860, and that local residents, in 1862 and 1865 referendums, voted to keep their regions as part of Marquette County and ignore the state statute.

Stanuch's research was discussed between Green Lake and Marquette county officials, who decided to honor the wishes of the two referendums

And in an approximately sesquicentennial notion, the Green Lake County Board of Supervisors, in December 2010, resolved that the county would help change the state statute, and obey the current defacto county boundary

A similar resolution will appear before the Marquette County Board of Supervisors soon, and if passed, the counties will move toward asking the state to set the record back to where it was before 1858

So what do the handful of residents in Marquette County (who actually live in Green Lake County) think about their unusual but unchanging position? No much

Matthew Schoebel, a resident born and raised in the boundary land, said he didn't care where the state thought he lived, as long as nothing in his life changed.

"I protty much bet that if you call anybody around here they'd all say the same," he said

Rex Jacobson shared Schoebel's lack of enthusiasm about the non-change, even though Jacobson has lived on or owned property there for most of his 80-year life. His family manages nearly 100 acres of logging land in the area; still, "it doesn't matter to (him) where the boundary is "

After hearing that she technically has lived in Green Lake County for five years - despite filing votes and taxes in Marquette County - but will remain living in Marquette County after all, Janice Snyder first said she was "confused."

Then she said she was glad that she didn't have to pay Green Lake County taxes. But then, "upon reflection," she "doesn't feel any different "


She's lived in both counties before, and she's fine with either one.

"I like Marquette County all right," she said. "It never done me any wrong "



AN ACT to amend 2.01 (24) and (39); and to create 992.?? and 23.25(?) of the statutes, relating to changing the descriptions of the boundaries of Green Lake and Marquette counties.

1979 Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill changes the statutory description of the boundaries of Green Lake and Marquette counties. Currently, the boundary line between the 2 counties described in the statutes does not correspond to the boundary line shown on maps of the counties. This bill changes the statutory description of the boundary lines of the 2 counties to conform to the boundaries of the counties shown on the maps. In addition, the bill provides that actions which occurred in Green Lake or Marquette county prior to the effective date of this bill will be considered to have occurred in the respective county as it is described in this bill.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1 2.01 (24) and (39) of the statutes are amended to read:
