Hello Robin and Peter.

I am requesting two bill drafts. Both of the drafts would create a public/private partnership (PPP) capable of accepting donations, gifts, grants, etc. from individuals and businesses for these initiatives. Public donations, from state or federal grants would be accepted as well.

1. The first PPP would be created in order for funds to go to the Wisconsin Conservation Endowment (see attached). The funds would be used for management of state public lands.

The difference in the attachment and what the bill draft would do is, the Joint Committee on Finance would have passive review of all funds used from the segregated endowment fund which includes money raised from the check off and other private donations.

The JFC would also have the authority to match the segregated endowment funds from the stewardship fund if they vote to do so.

The check offs would be created through rule by the DNR. The bill draft would not mandate a check off from all licenses and permits, DNR would be able to decide what is workable and what is not through rule.

2. The other PPP would be to create the "Governor's Read To Lead Endowment Fund". The fund would be able to accept private donations, gifts, etc. from individuals, organizations, and businesses as well as from public funds. The endowment fund would be a segregated fund within DOA managed by SWIB and with the authority to use money from the fund resting with a board created by Executive Order titled, the "Governor's Reading Council".

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

Well, maximum flexibility would mean that there are no restrictions at all. The council could award a grant to anyone. If you want to set some parameters, you might limit grant recipients to those entities that you think are likely to create "initiatives that improve reading skills." I'm not sure who that would be other than elementary and secondary schools, but if you're thinking of adult reading skills, you might want to add institutions of higher education, which would include technical colleges.

Should I take your email as an affirmative answer to the question of whether to exclude 19.56 (3) (f)?

Also, could you look at the remaining provisions that I included in yesterday's email and let me know if all of the language in each is needed? As I asked yesterday, why would the council or a council member *retain* anything of value? Anything of value received by the council will be deposited in the read to lead endowment fund. And why would we need to be concerned, in 19.56 (2) (b) 6., with a state public official *receiving* anything of value *from* the council?

Hi Michael,

I did include 19.56 (3) (em) in the list. Please note, however, that if you want the council to be able to do something in addition to awarding grants to public and private elementary and secondary schools, the draft will have to say what those powers or duties are. Right now, the council is limited to awarding grants to public and private elementary schools, not universities, libraries, or other nonprofits. (And just out or curiosity, why would the council "retain" anything of value? All contributions to the fund must be deposited in the fund.)

And what about (3) (f)? As I mentioned in my earlier email, I'm not sure why that one is needed. Under what circumstances would a state public official be receiving anything of value from the council?

Are you planning to also include 19.56(3) (em), which is cited in par. (f)? I think it might be necessary so the council could "solicit, receive and retain on behalf of the state anything of value for the purpose of hosting individuals in order to promote <u>reading</u>." Many of these grants could go to schools but certainly not all of them would. They might go to universities, libraries, or other non-profits that promote reading. Might we be better safe than sorry and just include all of it?

Hi Waylon,

I spoke to Michael, who told me that Tourism is exempt from some ethics laws dealing with fundraising. I searched the stats looking for those exemptions, and found the following cites. Please let me know if you want the governor's council to have exemptions and provisions similar to these, or if there's something you need for the council that is not listed below.

Now that I've looked at these provisions more closely, I think it's possible that not all may be needed if the council's only roles are fundraising and awarding grants to schools. For example, s. 19.56 (3) (f) would allow a public official to receive and retain from the council anything of value which the council is authorized to provide. If the council is awarding grants only to public and private schools, this paragraph may be unnecessary.

13.625 (10) This section does not apply to the solicitation, acceptance or furnishing of anything of pecuniary value by the *department of tourism*, or to a principal furnishing anything of pecuniary value to the *department of tourism*, under s. 19.56 (3) (em) or (f) for the activity specified in s. 19.56 (3) (em).

19.56(3) (em) A state public official who is an officer or employee of the department of tourism may solicit, receive and retain on behalf of the state anything of value for the purpose of hosting individuals in order to

promote tourism.

19.56(3) (f) A state public official...may receive and retain from the department of tourism anything of value which the department of tourism is authorized to provide under par. (em).

19.575 Tourism activities. The department of tourism shall file a report with the board no later than April 30 annually, specifying the source and amount of anything of value received by the department of tourism during the preceding calendar year for a purpose specified in s. 19.56 (3) (em) and the program or activity in connection with which the thing is received, together with the location and date of that program or activity.



### 2012 Education Initiatives

#### January 2012 Education Package

- I. Educator Effectiveness
  - A. Transparency and Accountability for Teacher Preparation Programs
    - 1. Create a Report Card for each program similar to school and district report cards
      - a) Based on how students of recent graduates perform based on EE System
      - b) Report card must be prominently displayed on school's homepage and offered along with other admissions materials.
  - B. Implement Educator Effectiveness recommendations
    - 50% student outcomes with at least 15% of total coming from WKCE scores (where available). The remaining portion will be split equally between local assessments and student learning goals developed jointly by teachers and administrators
    - 50% educator practice based on 2011 Interstate Teacher Assessment and Support Consortium (InTASC)
      Model Core Teaching Standards (teachers) and the 2008 Interstate School Leaders Licensure
      Consortium (ISLLC) Educational Leadership Policy Standards (principals).
    - 3. Mandatory reporting to parents if student has a "probationary" teacher three years in a row, otherwise not subject to open records requests.
- II. Read to Lead: implement recommendations
  - A. Require all students to take early childhood screener in 4K and 5K by 2012-13
  - B. Require DPI to update licensure exam for all elementary educators to one based on MTEL by 2013-14
- III. School Accountability
  - A. Description of report card:
    - 1. Must include measures of value added growth and proficiency
    - 2. Must rate schools on 1-100 corresponding to one of five categories (Exemplary, Above Adequate, Adequate, Below Adequate, Failing)
  - B. Report card must be prominently displayed on school homepage and offered along with admissions materials
  - C. If more than 75% of schools are Exemplary or Above Adequate, standards must be raised.
- IV. Other Possible Initiatives
  - A. Alternative Licensure
    - 1. Alternative principal licensure modeled after Colorado's program. Before gaining employment as a principal and enrolling in an alternative preparation program, a candidate must have a bachelor's degree & documented evidence of:
      - a) A traditional teaching degree and 3+ years of teaching experience;
      - b) 3+ years teaching as an unlicensed teacher; or
      - c) 3+ years of other management experience (business, military, etc.)
    - 2. Allow teachers to teach less than full course load if they fulfill other contractual obligations
  - B. End MPS Residency (SB-34/AB-44) bill authored by Kestell/Darling would prevent teacher residency from being a condition of employment

Hi Michael.

I have a few questions about this draft. First, I should have pointed out earlier the disadvantage of creating the governor's reading council by executive order. The council will expire when a new governor takes office unless the new governor by executive order provides for its continued existence. If you'd like to see examples of a governor's council created by statute, look at s. 14.017.

An EO is probably fine.

So you're OK with the termination of the council?

Second, are you familiar with s. 14.20, Wis.Stats.? It authorizes the governor to award grants to local governmental units and nonprofit organizations for support of literacy improvement programs. Have you considered revising this program instead of creating a new one?

I think revising would be fine as long as we can ensure there are no restrictions on where fundraising could come from. Do you want to revise? Or would you rather leave the bill as is?

Finally, councils are advisory in nature only. They can't promulgate rules, and are intended only to study and make recommendations to the person or body they advise. In this draft, we can solve this problem either by having the governor award the grants (after receiving recommendations from the council) or by explicitly providing an exemption for the council. See, for example, s. 15.01 (4). Let me know which option you choose.

I think an advisory body is fine.

I'll have the governor award the grants based on council recommendations. Okay?

Now for a few questions about the outline. As I mentioned yesterday, I need to know what screening device you want to mandate. Would it initially be administered in the 2012-13 school year? And annually thereafter? Will school districts be reimbursed by the state for the costs of administering the screen? Must a school district provide a special reading program, or intervene in any way, to help a pupil if the screen identifies the pupil as one who is in danger of reading failure?

Yes 2012-13 and thereafter. The state will pay for it. I don't think we need to specify WHAT they do but we should probably include something that says the district must utilize scientific research-based practices to intervene. Would that work?

Will the state pay for the screening from GPR? For 100% of the costs? How much do you want to appropriate for that purpose in 2012-13? To whom do you want it appropriated for distribution to school districts, DPI?

Regarding updating the licensure exam, I noticed that MTEL is actually a number of different tests. Which ones do you want DPI to base its licensure exam on? Is this only for applicants who will be teaching in grades K to 5? Will it apply only to those applying for an initial license or to applicants for renewals as well?

The MTEL exam we are looking at is the "Foundations of Reading" exam. It should be for any teacher applying for an elementary education license both new or renewal.

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
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
