#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill creates a segregated fund, designated the governor's read to lead development fund, consisting of all contributions made to the fund. The bill appropriates moneys in the fund to the governor to award grants in support of literacy and early childhood development programs. The Read to Lead Development Council, created by executive order, is directed to advise the governor on grant recipients.

The bill exempts the members of the Read to Lead Development Council from the law that prohibits state public officials from accepting anything of value and from the law that prohibits agencies from soliciting or accepting anything of value from a lobbyist or a lobbyist's employer, if development the purpose of awarding the grants described above.

Peter.

We have a couple changes that may make this work more smoothly:

1. Delete the section exempting members of the council and agencies from the law that prohibits soliciting and accepting anything of value. Essentially, the entire second paragraph of the analysis.

This will not be needed because public officials and agency members on the council will not be soliciting donations.

- 2. Call the "read to lead development fund" the read to lead "trust" fund.
- 3. Don't create the council by E.O., create it in statute (in the bill). So we need added to the bill the creation of the Read to Lead Development Council. They would then vote to spend funds from the account to support literacy and early childhood development programs. This is the suggested language to do this:
  - 1. The Council shall consist of the Governor or designee, the State Superintendent or designee, the Chair of the Senate Education Committee or designee, the Chair of the Assembly Education Committee or designee, the Ranking Member of the Senate Education Committee or designee, the Ranking Member of the Assembly Education Committee or designee, and the following fifteen (15) members designated by and serving at the pleasure of the Governor:
    - a. Two (2) practicing Wisconsin elementary educators;
    - b. A practicing Wisconsin preschool educator;
    - c. Three (3) members representing Wisconsin's philanthropic community;
    - d. Three (3) members representing Wisconsin's business community;
    - e. A member representing the Wisconsin State Reading Association;
    - A member representing the Wisconsin Reading Coalition;
    - g. A member representing the International Dyslexia Association;
    - h. A member representing Wisconsin Literacy;
    - i. A member representing the Wisconsin Library Association; and
    - A member representing Wisconsin's research community.

- The Chair shall be the Governor or designee, and the Vice-Chair shall be the State Superintendent or designee.
- 3. The Council shall exist for the exclusive purpose of improving reading outcomes in the State of Wisconsin.
- 4. The Council shall provide an annual report to the appropriate standing committees of each house of the Legislature in the manner provided under Wis. Stat. § 13.172(3) and to the Governor.
