Hi Robin, great job drafting this bill. The only remaining issues seem to stem from a lack of clarity in my earlier drafting request. Could you please make the following changes?:

Please add language requiring DNR to create adult hunter and trapper education programs that participants can take through the DNR (ie: not through the current network of volunteers). Require the courses to be offered online, with field a field day and testing to be administered at least bimonthly at the DNR service centers. You need not include archery ed in this as that is an advanced course that is not a prerequisite for licensure.

- Please remove language in the bill that would require DNR to offer testing at service

centers for the vouth hunter/trapper/archer education program.

- Please remove Elk and Class A Bear approvals from the list of approvals that can be purchased for \$5 / half price.

- On page 7, line 4-5, please have the study focus on areas with a bellow-average percentage of total land that is open to public hunting, not just private land open to public hunting.

- Please let me know if you did not understand my message yesterday about the

effective date.
