

### STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

Current law authorizes the state to incur public debt for certain conservation activities under the stewardship program, which is administered by DNR. The state may incur this debt to acquire land for the state and may award grants to certain local governmental units and nonprofit conservation organizations to acquire lands for these conservation activities.

This bill prohibits DNR from awarding a grant under the stewardship program unless DNR first considers whether the grant will benefit local businesses and the economy of this state. It also prohibits DNR from acquiring land under the stewardship program unless hunting, fishing, trapping, hiking, and cross—country skiing will be allowed on the land acquired or unless every member of the natural resources board approves the land acquisition.

### OTHER PROVISIONS

Under current law, a person must have a sturgeon spearing license issued by DNR in order to spear lake sturgeon. Current law requires a person to be at least 14 years old to obtain a sturgeon spearing license. Under this bill, a person may obtain a sturgeon spearing license if the person is at least 12 years old.

This bill also requires DNR to designate the first full weekend in January as a special event weekend during which a person may engage in ice fishing without holding or paying a fee for a fishing license.

Is this consistent with your intent?

Please note that the substitute amendment reduces first-time license fees only for annual hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses to ensure that a person does not get the benefit of the reduced fee more than once by obtaining, for example, an annual license one year and then a five-day license the next year.

You requested that the draft provide for a half-priced trapping license for a person who is under 16. Under this substitute amendment, the reduced fee trapping license is only for youths who are residents. The substitute amendment does not reduce the fee for nonresident trapping licenses because generally under current law reduced fee hunting licenses issued to youth apply to residents only. See, for example, s. 29.563 (2) (a) 4. and 5g. Is this O.K.?

As under Assembly Bill 311, this substitute amendment requires the Sporting Heritage Council to study specific issues before June 30, 2014. One of those issues concerns options and recommendations for increasing access to private land. Should this language continue to refer to access to private land? Or did you want the substitute amendment to require that the Council study options and recommendations with regard to access to public land as well?

With regard to your instruction to change the \$20 credit to a "half-priced license". Does this apply only to hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses? Does it apply to hunting approvals other than licenses, such as stamps or tags?

With regard to the requirement to offer field training at DNR service centers: I think the language in the amendment does not limit field testing to a given location. The amendment requires DNR to make field testing available through (not at) a DNR service center. So I think the language in the amendment gives DNR flexibility to offer the testing outdoors. Do you agree?
