Please draft 2 amendments to LRBs0212 that:

- 1. Create Northern and Southern winter gamefish zones (use Hwy 10 as the dividing line), maintaining the current end of season in the South and extending the end one week later in the North (Spring hearing question #82)
  - Allow a disabled hunter and up to two hunter companions, to hunt from a watercraft (pontoon boat) and/ or a specially designed blind that may not meet the natural vegetation concealment requirement of NR 10.001(20) "Open Water" (Spring hearing question #66); and
    - a. Create a Disabled Veteran's Recreational Card, at reduced cost (to cover administrative costs), for Wisconsin residents who are veterans with a service connected disability greater than 50% which would include fishing and small game hunting approvals Spring hearing question #75
