Wisconsin Disabled FireArm Hunt

Problem: The problem is there are people with permanent upper extremity disabilities that need the assistance of a mechanical device and/or help from another person to SAFELY discharge a firearm. These people are NOT allowed to hunt with a firearm during the special firearm season for disabled hunters.

Solution: The solution would include someone with:

* an amputation or other loss of one or both arms above the wrist or

* a permanent substantial loss of function in one or both hands or one or both arms (requires testing administered by or under the direction of a licensed physician)

This could be done by submitting the same form # 3600-162 which is the same process used to qualify someone to fish or troll with an electric motor.

Be it resolved: At the annual Conservation Congress meeting in Outagamie County on April 11th, 2011. It is recommended that the congress work with the Department of Natural Resources to change the rules for the WI disability firearm hunt to include people with upper extremity disabilities.

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

At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

1. Page 1, line 10: after "programs;" insert "Class D hunting permits issued to certain disabled persons;".

 $\sqrt{2}$. Page 4, line 18: after that line insert:

"Section 4m. 29.053 (3) of the statutes is amended to read:

29.053 (3) The department may modify any requirement of this chapter or rules promulgated under it, establish special seasons, authorize the use of special equipment or take any other action in order to provide additional hunting and fishing opportunities for persons who are physically disabled or visually handicapped and . The department may limit the number of persons involved, except that if the department establishes a special season for hunting deer with firearms for persons

1	who are physically disabled, the season shall be open to persons who have been

Please review this amendment very closely to ensure that it meets your intent. The amendment creates a Class D disabled hunting permit for the very limited purpose that you have described. Please pay particular attention to the language in the amendment that concerns the type of assistance that the permit holder is authorized to receive. It borrows language from current law but is crafted to give DNR flexibility to authorize the use of other types of assistance. Please give me a call if you have any questions.
