Incentives for recruitment. To the greatest extent possible, the department shall establish a program to recognize people who recruit others as hunters, trappers, and anglers. The program shall include a component under which a person who is issued his or her first hunting, trapping, or fishing approval in his or her lifetime may designate one person as the person who encouraged the applicant to obtain the license. The program shall provide for all of the following:

Create New Section

Revise 29.037 in the following manner:

29.037 (1) This state assents to the provisions of 16 USC 669 to 669k and 777 to 777L. The department is authorized and directed to perform any acts necessary to establish cooperative wildlife restoration projects and cooperative fish restoration and management projects in compliance with these federal provisions and with regulations promulgated by the secretary of the interior. No funds accruing to this state from license fees paid by hunters and from sport and recreation fishing license fees may be diverted for any other purpose than the administration of the department when it is exercising its responsibilities that are specific to the management of the fish and wildlife resources of this state.

29.037 (2) On or before March 15 of each even-numbered year, the department shall submit to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for distribution to the appropriate standing committees under s. 13.172 (3), a report identifying the department's use and expenditure of funds provided to the department under 16 USC 669 to 669k or 777 to 777L.

Senator Kedzie requests a Senate Substitute Amendment to the Engrossed and corrected copy of 2011 AB 311 (LRB 3481/1), to reflect revisions in the following manner.

Section 1

SPORTING HERITAGE COUNCIL. There is created in the department of natural resources a sporting heritage council consisting of the following members:

The secretary of natural resources, or his or her designee, who shall serve as chairperson.

The secretary of tourism, or his or her designee, who shall serve as vice-chairperson.

Five members from nominations provided by sporting organizations that have as their primary objective the promotion of hunting or trapping. Of the 5 members, one shall represent the interests of deer hunters, one shall represent the interests of bear hunters, one shall represent the interests of upland game hunters, and one shall represent the interests of furbearing animal hunters and trappers.

- The deer hunting representative shall be appointed by the secretary of natural resources.
- The bear hunting representative shall be appointed by the speaker of the assembly.
- The waterfowl hunting representative shall be appointed by the senate majority leader
- The upland game hunting representative shall be appointed by the chair of the appropriate senate standing committee that deals with natural resources issues.
- The furbearing animal hunting and trapping representative shall be appointed by the chair of the appropriate assembly standing committee that deals with natural resources issues.

One member, appointed by the Governor, from nominations provided by a sporting organization that has as its primary objective the promotion of fishing.

One member, appointed by the executive committee of the conservation congress, who is a member of the conservation congress.

Delete line 18 on page 3 of the engrossed bill.

Delete lines 5-9 on page 4 of the engrossed bill.

Delete, "or a disabled veteran recreation card issued under s. 29.236" on Page 4, lines 12-13 and 16 of the bill.

Delete Section 4m on Page 5 of the engrossed bill.

INTENT of Senate Substitute Amendment to AB 311:

- Reduces the size of the Sporting Heritage Council from 16 members to 9, but maintains the core pertinent members. Adds the Secretary of Tourism, or a designee of the Secretary, as Vice-Chair.
- Allows individual members to be selected by several key elected officials, rather than just the DNR Secretary, who is also the Chair.
- Delete a requirement the committee meet at least four times per year; deleting this requirement leaves it to the discretion of the Chair.
- Delete a provision that the DNR may not award Stewardship funds unless it first considers whether the grant will benefit local businesses and the economy.
- Delete the 'north/south' open fishing season closure provision.
- Delete a requirement the DNR award prizes to persons as an incentive for recruiting hunters, trappers, and anglers.
- Delete the creation of a free Veterans Disabled Recreation Card.
- Retain youth sturgeon spear-fishing to persons at least 14 years old.
- Change field training testing for the Hunter Safety education course from "bimonthly" to "every two months".
- Create a requirement the DNR provide a report to the Legislature every 2 years regarding its use of monies received from the federal Pittman-Robertson Act.

Dan:

I have another question that concerns duplicate approvals. Current law specifies reduced fees for duplicate approvals (see 29.563 (12)). Should the draft provide that for a first time license holder, the fee for a duplicate license (which is already reduced) should be further reduced? And, if so, does the reduction in the fee for a duplicate only apply to duplicates of those approvals already specified in the bill? For example, the bill does not provide for a reduced fee for a conservation patron license for a first timer, but current law specifies a reduced fee for a duplicate of that license. And the fee for a duplicate approval may or may not already be less than the reduced fee specified under the bill for first time licensees. I think we will have to talk about this one so that I make sure I understand the instructions. I will give you a call when I finish with the rest of the redraft and we can sort this out.


Under the engrossed bill, first time users receive a reduced fee for certain approvals or privileges. However, it does not contemplate the issuance of a duplicate approval for a first time user who may lose or misplace their approval. Thus, add language to ensure a first time user may receive a duplicate approval or license at the same reduced rate.

Robin and Mary,

I've looked over the preliminary amendment for AB 311 and request the following changes.

First, per the drafter's note, do not add a wildlife damage surcharge to the Veteran's Recreation card.

Page 2, line 13 -22 – Per our revised instructions, please make the following changes to this section, to reflect:

- Two members of the state assembly, appointed by the assembly speaker, who may not be members of the same political party.
- Two members of the state senate, appointed by the senate majority leader, who may not be members of the same political party.
- Five members, appointed by the Natural Resource Board, from nominations provided by sporting organizations that have as their primary objective the promotion of hunting, fishing, or trapping. Of the 5 members, one shall represent the interests of deer hunters, one shall represent the interests of bird hunters, one shall represent the interests of fishers, and one shall represent the interests of furbearing animal hunters and trappers.

Also, I do not see any language regarding the eligibility criteria for a Class D disabled permit, as we requested. Thus, this language needs to be added:

The department shall issue to any person a Class D Permit if the person meets any of the qualifications in section (a) or (b) and meets the standards in section (c)

(a)

- 1. Has an amputation or other loss of one or more arms at or above the elbow.
- 2. Has a permanent substantial loss of function in one or both arms and fails to meet the minimum standards of any one of the following standard tests, administered under the direction of a licensed physician or a licensed chiropractor:
 - 1. Upper extremity pinch.
 - 2. Grip.
 - 3. Nine-hole peg
- (b) Has a permanent substantial loss of function in one or both shoulders and fails to meet the minimum standards of the standard shoulder strength tests, administered under the direction of a licensed physician or a licensed chiropractor.
- (c)
- 1. Meets one of the following:
 - A Is unable to place their non-dominant hand or prosthesis in a position level with their shoulders and at a minimum of 27 inches from their body

- Is unable to place their dominant hand or prosthesis in a position level with their shoulders at a minimum of 11 inches from their body.
- 2. Is unable to hold a 5 pound weight for 10 seconds while their non-dominant hand or prosthesis is held in the position identified in (c)(1) 1.
