Specific Statutory Change Amend S.341.145(1)(d) to allow personalized plate message not exceeding 6 positions, rather than the current 4 positions.	
Administrative Problem with Current Statute S. 341.145(1)(d) defines a personalized plate for Disabled Veteran license plate. This reference states that the maximum number of characters available for a personalized plate message is 4 positions. The limit of 4 characters on the plate was established many years ago, when the license plate only allowed a total of 6 characters for the plate number and the plate design, which was specified in statute, used two of the 6 positions for characters that denoted the Disabled Veteran plate type. Recent statute change no longer specifies the plate design, and the new Disabled Veteran plate design will allow up to 6 characters for personalized plate message, similar to all other special plates.	
Justification/Need for Change DMV is prohibited by this provision from offering longer personalized plate message that is technically possible to offer.
