Hi Christian, Here is some information about this program:

These programs are authorized under s. 29.889, Stats. Under the wildlife damage abatement assistance program (for prevention) and the wildlife damage claim program (for partial compensation), the type of wildlife damage covered is limited to damage caused by deer (not farm-raised deer), bear, geese, turkey, sandhill cranes (if hunting is authorized by the DNR) and elk (if DNR has established a hunting season for elk), to commercial seedlings or crops growing on agricultural land, damage to crops that have been harvested for sale or further use but that have not been removed from the agricultural land, damage to orchard trees or nursery stock or damage to apiaries or livestock.

Counties administer the program with oversight by DNR.

Under s. 29.889 (7), Stats., a person who receives either abatement assistance or damage claim payments must permit hunting of the type of wild animals causing the wildlife damage on that land. In order to satisfy this requirement, the land must be open to hunting during the appropriate open season, subject to certain conditions. If you are thinking of adding cougars to the list above, it seems an exception should be created under this provision since cougars are not a huntable species.
