Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

BILL SUMMARY:

This bill creates new operating restrictions for instruction permits and probationary licenses. Specifically, it restricts the operation of a motor vehicle or motor cycle while using a cellular telephone or other wireless telecommunications device, except to report an emergency. This would apply to all drivers with an instruction permit and all probationary drivers under the age of 18 for the first nine months of license issuance. The Bill applies the same penalties as those for restriction violations under s. 343.07 (7), including double demerit points if the driver has any prior violations.

ASSUMPTIONS:

The Department cannot determine the number of potential convictions for this particular violation at this time. The DMV computer system will require minor updates to add the new statutory reference so these types of violations may be identified.

No new charge code will be developed for this conviction since it can be identified separately from other restriction violations based on the statute number listed as violated on the conviction report.

This bill would create new restrictions that are required to be added to the instruction permit or probationary license at the time of issuance. Because of space limitations and the restrictions currently required on these types of licenses, the addition of a new restriction would require printing an additional driver's license card for all probationary license holders who also have the corrective lenses restriction. This will cost \$2.25 for each additional card that has to be printed to accommodate the additional restrictions. In 2010 WisDOT issued 65,533 probationary licenses. Of those, 21,903 drivers also had the corrective lenses restriction on their license. To add the new restrictions to this group of licensees would cost the Department approximately \$49,282 annually.

CONCLUSION:

DMV must add new statutory citation to the DMV computerized violation system, involving minimal work, which DMV can absorb. Due to space limitations, DMV will be required to issue a second card to probationary license holders in order to list the additional restrictions required by this bill which would create an average annual cost of \$49,282 that DMV cannot absorb.

Local fiscal impact is indeterminate. Local costs, and local revenue, would depend on enforcement level by local law enforcement, and conviction level by the courts.
