## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Assembly Bill(AB)337 prevents a volunteer health care provider from providing instruction in human growth and development as allowed under current law. The Department of Administration (DOA) reviews and approves applications from volunteer health care providers who wish to provide services without charge in a school or nonprofit agency, and provides medical malpractice coverage for those activities.

Removing the "instruction" activity would not substantially reduce or eliminate the overall exposures associated with providing health care. DOA Risk Management currently has the administrative task of approving applications for providers and by default, answering many associated questions relating to the volunteer health care program. Conceivably the program could experience increased phone calls related to the change in the near term, likely subsiding as any changes are implemented.
