Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Current law requires the Department of Health Services (DHS) to utilize appropriated state and federal funds (women's health funds) to provide counseling, information, and referral for family planning services. Further, current law requires DHS to distribute these funds solely to public entities that do not provide or make referrals for abortion services, or have an affiliate that provides or makes referrals for abortion services. The state portion of these funds is currently referred to as the women's health block grant.

AB 348/SB 282 removes restrictions on the type of entity to which DHS can distribute women's health funds and eliminates referring to the state portion of these funds as the "women's health block grant." In addition, AB 348/SB 282 increases family planning services funding by \$193,600 GPR for each year of the 2011-2013 biennium.

This legislation is expected to increase funding to the DHS appropriation 20.435(1)(f) by \$387,200 GPR over the biennium. The Department anticipates no fiscal impact for the remaining changes.
