## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Under Article VI, Section 4 (1) (c) of the State Constitution, each county in the state is required to have an elected county register of deeds and an elected county treasurer. These county officials serve for a term of 4 years.

Under the bill, the offices of register of deeds and treasurer would be eliminated in any county that has a population of at least 750,000 (currently only Milwaukee County). The duties of these officials would be transferred to the county clerk.

To the extent that the duties carried out by the register of deeds and treasurer can be absorbed by the clerk's office with no additional staff, administrative costs for Milwaukee County could decline by a small amount, primarily related to the salary and benefits currently paid to the register of deeds and treasurer.

The bill imposes no costs on the Department of Revenue.
