## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

AB631 requires UW System institutions to provide financial literacy information as part of its orientation of new students. While UW institutions currently provide financial information/training to certain students, it is not provided to all new students or necessarily during orientation. Each institution would have to determine how best to deliver the training and materials. The cost will vary by institution but we believe it could be managed within current funding levels assuming students can be provided written materials and/or directed to existing financial training sources.
