Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill permits an agency to promulgate an administrative rule only if a bill authorizing promulgation of the rule is enacted into law.

This bill would obviously cause a variety of changes in the department's rule-making processes, including longer time to promulgate, decreased certainty over promulgation, fewer total rules promulgated, and progressively more out-of-date administrative code.

Some effects would reduce agency spending while others would increase agency spending. The net fiscal effect is impossible to forecast.
