## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

Current law, enacted as part of Wisconsin Act 32 on July 1, 2011, requires the Department of Health Services (DHS) to request federal Medicaid law waivers related to family planning services provided under the Medical Assistance program. These waivers include: 1) Providing optional services for family planning; 2) Requiring parental notification for family planning services for a women under the age of 18; and 3) Requiring DHS to use the income of a parent or guardian as family income when determining the incomeeligibility of a women under the age of 18 for family planning services.

SB 279 would require DHS to restore federal Medicaid law waivers that existed prior to the enactment of Wisconsin Act 32 on July 1, 2011. Specifically, the bill restores eligibility for family planning services for women and men up to 300 percent of the federal poverty level. In addition, the bill eliminates the ability of DHS to change eligibility criteria for family planning services and the requirement that DHS request Medicaid law waivers relating to parental notification and income-eligibility for women less than 18 years of age.

The Department anticipates the requirement under this bill to provide family planning services to incomeeligible men will increase DHS expenses by \$487,900 AF (\$73,000 GPR and \$414,000 FED) over the biennium. There is no fiscal impact anticipated for county human service agencies.
