Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Senate Bill (SB) 93 relates to going armed with weapons, possessing or transporting a firearm, bow, or crossbow under certain circumstances, disorderly conduct limitations, and electric weapons. This fiscal estimate addresses only the fiscal impact on the Department of Administration.

Senate Bill 93 eliminates the prohibition against going armed with or possessing a firearm in a public building or tavern but includes general prohibitions against carrying weapons into a police station, a law enforcement or incarceration setting, courthouses, certain areas in airports, and a building owned or leased by the state or any political subdivision of the state if the building provides electronic screening for weapons at all public entrances to the building and provides locked storage for weapons on the premises while the person carrying the weapon is in the building.

The bill contains language that would make it a misdemeanor to carry a weapon or firearm into "Any portion of a building that is a police station, sheriff's office, or state patrol station." The State Capitol contains the main station of the Division of Capitol Police; and Capitol Police Officers are stationed at the Milwaukee State Office Building. It is unclear what portion of the State Capitol and the Milwaukee State Office Building would be covered by the general prohibition for police stations contained in the bill.

At this time, it is unknown to what extent the Department of Administration would place electronic screening for weapons at the public entrances to the state office buildings and facilities owned or leased by the Department. The cost is therefore indeterminate.
