The Honorable, The Legislature:

We recently identified up to \$12.0 million in federal funds the Legislature could either direct the Department of Children and Families to spend on specific public assistance programs or lapse to the State’s General Fund for use as general purpose revenue (GPR) in the 2011–13 biennium. In addition, because

the Department of Administration did not make certain accounting entries at the end of fiscal year (FY) 2009–10, we believe it could immediately make \$668,478 available to the General Fund as GPR for the fiscal year that ends on June 30, 2011.
