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


Under current law, a person may apply to the municipal clerk in person to vote using an absentee ballot. In-person applications to vote using an absentee ballot may be made beginning on the 3rd Monday preceding the election and ending on the later of 5 p.m. or the close of business on the Friday preceding the election. Under this bill, in-person applications to vote using an absentee ballot may only be received Monday to Friday between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. each day. In addition, the clerk's office may not be open more than 40 hours a week beginning on the 3rd Monday preceding the election and ending on 5 p.m. on the Friday preceding the election in order to receive applications made in person.

SECTION 1. 6.86^x (1) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

6.86 (1) (b) Except as provided in this section, if application is made by mail, the application shall be received no later than 5 p.m. on the 5th day immediately preceding the election. If application is made in person, the application shall be made no earlier than the opening of business on the 3rd Monday preceding the

15 the election, the municipal clerk or the clerk's agent shall immediately take the ballot
16 to the court in which the elector is serving as a juror and deposit it with the judge.
17 The judge shall recess court, as soon as convenient, and give the elector the ballot.
18 The judge shall then witness the voting procedure as provided in s. 6.87 and shall
19 deliver the ballot to the clerk or agent of the clerk who shall deliver it to the polling
20 place or, in municipalities where absentee ballots are canvassed under s. 7.52, to the
21 municipal clerk as required in s. 6.88. If application is made under sub. (2) or (2m),
22 the application may be received no later than 5 p.m. on the Friday immediately
23 preceding the election.
