An ACT to amend 38.28 (1m) (a) 1.; and to create 20.292 (1) (aj) and 38.39 of the

statutes; relating to: workforce growth grants to technical college districts and

making an appropriation.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill allows a technical college district board to obtain grants from the Technical College System Board for the purpose of partnering with a business, consortium of businesses, economic development organization, or local workforce development board in a project to help meet local needs for supporting economic sectors with a documented skills gap or high workforce shortage, including manufacturing, energy, information technology, skilled trades, and health care. A project may provide for activities that address development of individuals prior to entering the workforce and workforce training, including any of the following: 1) job training scholarships based on local labor market needs; 2) building or infrastructure construction; 3) equipment and material purchases; 4) faculty hiring; 5) development of certain curricula; or 6) student career support services, including job placement and business recruitment. The bill directs the Technical College System Board to award grants to technical college districts that apply to the board to fund the costs of such projects. In awarding the grants, the bill requires the Technical College System Board to consider the speed by which the activities specified in applications could meet training and employment needs and give a preference to projects that seek to eliminate waiting lists for courses pertaining to jobs with high employment demand.
