Federal law does not require school buses weighing more than 10,000 pounds to be equipped with seat belts for passengers.

Also under current law, the Department of Transportation (DOT) must adopt and enforce rules, in the interests of safety, to cover the design, construction, inspection, and operation of school buses. Prior to the use of a motor vehicle as a school bus, the seller of the school bus must obtain a presale inspection of the school bus by DOT verifying compliance with DOT's rules relating to design and construction of school buses, and a copy of the presale inspection report must be provided to the purchaser. However, the purchaser and seller of the school bus may agree that the purchaser will obtain the presale inspection. The penalty for a violation of this requirement is a forfeiture of not less than \$10 nor more than \$200.

Hi Tracy,

Let's go with sum sufficient and yes, GPR. Regarding the question in the second e-mail, I think we will have to talk through that. I was thinking that we would be reimbursing the school district only once when the bus company purchases a seatbelt-equipped school bus. So any time a school district purchases a seatbelt-equipped bus, or a bus company purchases one for use by the school, the district would be able to apply for a grant to be partially reimbursed only once.

If you have any other ideas for how to do it if a school contracts with a bus company for bus service, please let me know.

Hi Kelley -

I am working on this draft and have a couple of questions:

- 1. I assume you want the funds to come from general purpose revenues (GPR) and not some other source?
- 2. Do you want the appropriation to be a "sum sufficient" appropriation or an "amounts in the schedule" appropriation?

A sum sufficient appropriation is one "in the amounts necessary to accomplish the purpose specified" and for practical purposes acts as a blank check. "Amounts in the schedule," on the other hand, are specified amounts and when they are spent, they are spent (even if, in this case, some school districts have not yet accomplished the transition to seatbelt-equipped buses).

3. If you want the appropriation to be an "amounts in the schedule," do you want it to be annual, biennial, or continuing? Annual appropriations are "expendable only up to the amount shown in the schedule and only for the fiscal year for which made;" biennial appropriations are "expendable only for the biennium for which made;" and continuing appropriations "are appropriations which are expendable until fully depleted or repealed by subsequent action of the legislature." So, in the case of a continuing appropriation, if there are funds left over at the end of the biennium, they will rollover into the next biennium.

- 4. If you want the appropriation to be an "amounts in the schedule," what amount should I place in the schedule for each year of the biennium?
- 5. Finally, if the appropriation is an "amounts in the schedule," do you want to require the department to pro-rate the grants such that, if too many school districts apply for grants, the funds available shall be pro-rated amongst applicants? If yes, I may need to ask follow-up questions (such as do you want to require school districts to apply for grants at specified times, or restrict the times at which the department may award grants)

## INSERT ANALYSIS

Under current law, a school district may provide pupil transportation by contracting with a common carrier, taxi company or other party, including a pupil's parent, or by purchasing and operating a motor vehicle. This bill establishes a grant program to defray the costs to a school district that provides pupil transportation on school buses equipped with safety belts. Under the grant program, a school district that purchases its own school buses may apply to receive a grant equal to 50 percent of the cost of each safety belt-equipped school bus. A school district that contracts with a school bus operator for pupil transportation may apply to receive 50 percent of the difference between the cost to the school bus operator to purchase a school bus equipped with safety belts and the cost to the school bus operator to purchase a school bus without safety belts.

Another re-draft of LRB-0645: Seat belts on school buses

Hi Tracy,

We are going to simplify the grant program. Instead of making a distinction between school districts that own their school buses and districts that contract with a bus company, we simply want to create a grant program to reimburse any district for half the cost of a school bus that is attributable to installing seat belts.

So if a school bus with seat belts costs \$120,000 and one without costs \$100,000, the district could apply for a \$5,000 grant.

Again, under the bill, DPI would promulgate rules for awarding the grants.

### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, if a motor vehicle is required by federal law to be equipped with seat belts, the motor vehicle cannot be bought, sold, or leased in Wisconsin unless the vehicle is so equipped. Federal law does not require school buses weighing more than 10,000 pounds to be equipped with seat belts for passengers.

Also under current law, the Department of Transportation (DOT) must adopt and enforce rules, in the interests of safety, to cover the design, construction, inspection, and operation of school buses. Prior to the use of a motor vehicle as a school bus, the seller of the school bus must obtain a presale inspection of the school bus by DOT verifying compliance with DOT's rules relating to design and construction of school buses, and a copy of the presale inspection report must be provided to the purchaser. However, the purchaser and seller of the school bus may agree that the purchaser will obtain the presale inspection. Certain consequences follow if the presale inspection report shows that the school bus is not in compliance with DOT's rules relating to design and construction of school buses.

Also under current law, contracts for the transportation of pupils must, by reference, incorporate DOT's school bus rules.

Under this bill, a school bus that weighs more than 10,000 pounds and that is manufactured on or after a date approximately six months following the bill's
