Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Current law provides \$1,200,000 GPR to the Department to fund regional peer-run respite centers for individuals with mental health and substance abuse concerns.

SB 368 requires the Department to provide grants to counties to contract with peer-run organizations to establish peer-run respite centers for individuals experiencing mental health or substance abuse concerns. The bill limits grant awards to one-half the amount of money the county provides to contract with a peer-run organization to establish peer-run respite centers. SB 368 also appropriates \$125,000 GPR in each fiscal year of the fiscal biennium to the department for these grants under 20.435 (5)(bc), Wis. Stats.

The Department anticipates costs related to staff time and resources to implement this grant program, but can absorb these costs using existing resources.

Because the grants are voluntary, the bill does not impose any mandated costs to county human service agencies.
