Define Problem Precisely

Currently when a driver license or identification card is reinstated after being cancelled, except for certain cancellations under s.343.38(3g), the driver is issued a two-year product regardless of how much time they had left on their original license or identification card at the time of cancellation. For example, a customer may have paid for an 8 year product, had it cancelled while there was still 7 years left on it and then got it back with a two year expiration.

Description of Proposed Change

Amend s.343.38(3g) to allow all cancellations of driver license and identification cards to be issued for the time left on original license or ID card at the time of cancellation.

Justification for Change

This proposal would relieve a financial burden on the customer by giving them back the renewal period they've already paid for and it would extend the renewal period for many who currently have to come back in to a service center two years from reinstatement.

Under current law, a person's operator's license may be cancelled for a variety of reasons. For example, a license may be cancelled if the Department of Transportation (DOT) finds that the application for the license contained a material false statement or if a license has been altered and returned to DOT for cancellation. In most cases where a person's license has been cancelled, the person may apply for a new license at any time. A new license issued after cancellation expires two years from the date of the applicant's next birthday.

Under this bill, a new license issued after cancellation expires either two years from the applicant's next birthday or on the expiration date of the prior license at the time of cancellation, whichever is later.
