Should NR 45.04 (2) (a) 2. refer to NR 10.06 (general hunting hours) instead of 10.24 (Bong state rec area hunting hours)?

In addition, if the trapping language is added, it seems we should also refer to the general trapping hours in NR 10.13 (3). In other words, hunters may enter no earlier than one hour before hunting hours open, and trappers may enter no earlier than one hour before trapping hours open.

Closing hours

Under current law, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) designates a system of state trails as part of the state park system. Under DNR's current rules, with certain exceptions, no person may enter or be within the boundaries of any state park between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and the following 6:00 a.m. The bill amends DNR rules to exempt users of state trails from these nighttime closing hours, but allows DNR discretion to close a state trail or portion of a state trail at night by posting notice of closing hours.

Current law requires, with certain exceptions, that state parks be open to hunting, fishing, and trapping by persons who hold the appropriate hunting, fishing, or trapping license, permit, or other approval.
