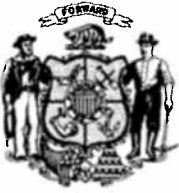

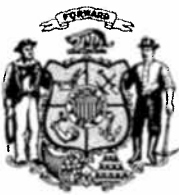

Sorry for the repeated requests on this, but people seem unable to make up their minds.

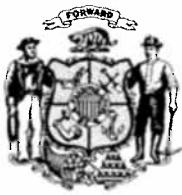
Please send a /2 draft that eliminates the requirement to have an written explanation on the sign. Apparently there are numerous signs in use that simply have the universal symbol.

I met with the Council on Physical Disabilities and have some changes for two of the drafts we currently have. I also learned that the reason some of the regulation on these issues is hard to find is that it's simply incorporated from the International Building Code by reference in DSPS rules.

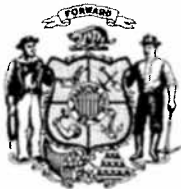
LRB 0451: We need to add a line that states one line 4 page 1 "and a van accessible space shall have an additional sign "Van Accessible" mounted below the symbol of accessibility." The IBC code requires 1 of every 6 handicapped spaces to be van accessible. The little sign they tag on the post below the regular sign shouldn't be cost prohibitive.
