Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a court may suspend an individual's operating privilege for up to two years if the individual is found guilty of violating a traffic regulation. Current law also permits a court to suspend for up to two years the operating privilege of an individual who has failed to pay a monetary judgement entered against the individual. This bill reduces the maximum time for which the operating privilege may be suspended by a court under these circumstances from two years to one.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 345.47 (1) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:

345.47 (1) (b) In lieu of imprisonment and in addition to any other suspension or revocation, that the defendant's operating privilege be suspended. The operating privilege shall be suspended for 30 days or until the person pays the forfeiture, plus costs, fees, and surcharges imposed under ch. 814, but not to exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ years one year.

- Serving the complete 2-vear one-vear suspension of the defendant's operating privilege does not relieve the defendant of the responsibility to pay the judgment.
