# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

under s. 13.172 (3), and post on the department's Internet site, a state rail plan. The

- 3. The addition of passenger rail service from Minneapolis to the Eau Claire-Chippewa Falls metropolitan area.
- 4. The addition of passenger rail service from Milwaukee or Chicago to the Green Bay and Fox Valley areas.
- 5. Adequate funding for future equipment orders of cars and locomotives to be used in passenger rail service in Wisconsin.
- 6. Adequate funding for the study of future passenger rail routes and service in Wisconsin.
