



## 2013 SENATE BILL 346

1     **AN ACT** *to renumber* 285.31 (6) (a); *to repeal and recreate* 285.31 (6) (b); and  
2             *to create* 285.31 (6) (ae) and 285.31 (6) (c) of the statutes; **relating to:** vapor  
3             recovery system removal grants.

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*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

4             **SECTION 1.** 285.31 (6) (a) of the statutes, as created by 2013 Wisconsin Act 20,  
5             is renumbered 285.31 (6) (am).

6             **SECTION 2.** 285.31 (6) (ae) of the statutes is created to read:

7             285.31 (6) (ae) In this subsection:

8             1. “Dispenser” means a device that dispenses fuel and measures the amount  
9             dispensed.

1           2. “Hanging hardware” means the equipment on the outside of a dispenser  
2 cabinet through which fuel is dispensed, including hose adapters, breakaway  
3 connectors, hoses, swivels, and nozzles.

4           3. “PEI/RP300–09” means the 2009 version of the Petroleum Equipment  
5 Institute publication Recommended Practices for Installation and Testing of  
6 Vapor–Recovery Systems at Vehicle–Fueling Sites.

7           **SECTION 3.** 285.31 (6) (b) of the statutes, as created by 2013 Wisconsin Act 20,  
8 is repealed and recreated to read:

9           285.31 (6) (b) The costs of all of the following are eligible costs under this  
10 subsection:

11           1. Labor and parts associated with any electrical work or programming  
12 required to convert an existing dispenser from operating with vapor recovery to  
13 operating without vapor recovery.

14           2. Labor and parts for replacing hanging hardware designed for vapor recovery  
15 on an existing dispenser with hanging hardware that is not designed for vapor  
16 recovery.

17           3. If the owner or operator replaces an existing dispenser with a new or used  
18 dispenser, the cost of the hanging hardware on the new or used dispenser.

19           4. Labor and parts to prepare the interior of a dispenser for the tests described  
20 in subd. 5., including the installation of a pipe plug in the vapor return line.

21           5. Conducting tests required by section 14 of PEI/RP300–09, but the costs of  
22 repair or parts associated with these tests or of any additional labor involved in the  
23 repair, replacement, or installation of parts not associated with the vapor recovery  
24 equipment are not eligible costs.
