Amendment 1:

I don't believe that there is an exception or exemption within the bill for sex registrants that are, themselves, students. I believe an exemption should be made for students. This could be drafted as an additional subsection to the bill explaining that the reporting requirement would not be necessary for a sex registrant that is present at the school which he or she is enrolled. (there is a slightly less strict reporting procedure for parents on the registry for attending schools that their children attend - I don't think we should require that much for students attending a school themselves). The idea here is the "Romeo and Juliet" cases of 17 year old male, 15 year old female, which is charged as second degree sexual assault because of her age and there is a mandatory registration for him - I believe 15 years. There is an partial or attempted exemption in the bill sub (3)(d) and (3m), but those exemptions apply only if the school district has "worked with the school . . . to ensure the safety of the students attending the school..."

Not only is this burdensome, it places a burden on the state and will probably subject them to liability if something goes wrong (despite the fact that a later sub section tries to immunize state agents).
