4. Release of Frozen Financial Institution Accounts

Specific Statutory Change:

Amend \$. 49.854 (5) (f) to require the department to instruct the financial institution to release a frozen account when the court determines that the child support arrears are not owed.

Administrative or Substantive Problem with Current Law and Need for the Change: Section 49.854 (5) (f) provides that if a payer requests a court hearing after his or her financial accounts have been frozen due to shild support arrears, and the court determines that the arrears are not owed, the department must return the seized funds to the payer. However, the department is not in possession of the funds as the account has simply been frozen.

Fiscal Effect: None

Earlier LRB Draft: LRB-0563/P1 and LRB-0568/2 [2011 Senate Bill 460]

Specific Statutory Change:

Amend s. 49.155 (1m) (a) (4) and (5) to replace "Wisconsin works agency" with "the department or county department or agency determining eligibility" consistent with all other eligibility agency references in s. 49.155 (1m).

- "4. If the Wisconsin works agency determines that basic education would facilitate the individual's efforts to maintain employment, participate in basic education, including an English as a 2nd language course; literacy tutoring; or a course of study meeting the standards established by the state superintendent of public instruction under s. 115.29 (4) for the granting of a declaration of equivalency of high school graduation. An individual may receive aid under this subdivision for up to 2 years.
- 5. Participate in a course of study at a technical college, or participate in educational courses that provide an employment skill, as determined by the department, if the Wisconsin works agency determines that the course or courses would facilitate the individual's efforts to maintain employment. An individual may receive aid under this subdivision for up to 2 years."

Administrative or Substantive Problem with Current Law and Need for the Change: 2009 Wisconsin Act 28 amended s. 49.155 (1m) to designate that for Shares program eligibility services outside Milwaukee County, the department shall contract with a "county department or agency" (as defined in s. 49.155 (1) (ah)) to determine the Shares eligibility of individuals residing outside Milwaukee County. Prior to this change, W2 agencies were the only agencies designated in statute to perform eligibility services for the Shares child care subsidy program. Consistent with the Act 28 changes, the department currently contracts with counties and tribes (not W2 agencies) for Shares eligibility services outside Milwaukee County. 2009 Wisconsin Act 28 failed to replace the references to "Wisconsin works" in the above two paragraphs of s. 49.155 (1m) with "the department or county department or agency determining eligibility" as used throughout the remainder of s. 49.155 (1m).

2. Criminal History of Child Care Licensees

Specific Statutory Change:

Amend s. 48.685 (5) (br) 3m to remove the reference to s. 943.32 (2), robbery with a dangerous weapon.

Administrative or Substantive Problem with Current Law and Need for the Change: There is a conflict between s. 48.685 (5) (br) 3 and s. 48.685 (5) (br) 3m as created by 2009 Wisconsin Act 76. Section 48.685 (5) (br) 3 lists some of the crimes that are bared for child care licensees, staff, and residents in a home where child care is provided. Section 48.685 (5) (br) 3m lists crimes that only apply to licensees. Robbery with a dangerous weapon under s. 943.32 (2) appears in both places.

Fiscal Effect: None

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, the Department of Children and Families (DCF) is required to contract with a county department, the Milwaukee County enrollment services unit, a Wisconsin Works agency, a child care resource and referral agency, or another agency to determine eligibility for child care subsidies under Wisconsin Shares in a particular geographic region or for a particular Indian tribal unit. Under former law, Wisconsin Works agencies determined eligibility.

The statutes currently provide that an individual may be eligible for Wisconsin Shares if the Wisconsin Works agency determines that basic education or a course of study at a technical college would facilitate the individual's efforts to maintain employment and the individual needs child care services to participate in basic education or the course of study. The bill changes this so that the entity that makes this determination is DCF or the entity with which DCF contracts to determine eligiblity, which may be other than a Wisconsin Works agency.

Cindy:

I searched back through the history on this and found that, originally in the 2008 budget, "Wisconsin Works agency" was changed to "county department or agency" throughout sub. (1m), except for the two references that are being changed in this draft – which were missed at the time. An amendment for the Joint Finance sub added "the department or" before every change to "county department or agency." I did not look at the drafting instructions for that amendment (assuming I can find them!), but I think the idea was that, in Milwaukee County, the department would determine eligibility if the department did not contract with the unit under s. 49.825 (2) (b) (note the "Except as provided in s. 49.155 (3g)" in sub. (1m) (intro.)). However, sub. (3g) (a) isn't real explicit that the department determines eligibility in Milw. Co. – only that the department doesn't have to contract with the unit to do it. So if that interpretation is consistent with the intent – or practice – you are correct that "department" should be added in this draft and that it is a technical correction.

I am responding to your drafter's note on the above draft.

I was trying to use the definition included in s.49.155 (ah) as noted below.

49.155 Wisconsin Shares; child care subsidy. (1) Definitions.

In this section, except as otherwise provided:

(ag) "Child care provider" means a provider licensed under s. 48.65, certified under s. 48.651 or established or contracted for

under s. 120.13 (14).

(ah) "County department or agency" means a county department under s. 46.215, 46.22, or 46.23, the unit, as defined in s. 49.825 (1) (e), or a Wisconsin Works agency, child care resource

and referral agency, or other agency.

(1m) ELIGIBILITY. Except as provided in s. 49.155 (3g), the department shall contract with a county department or agency to determine the eligibility of individuals residing in a particular geographic region or who are members of a particular Indian tribal

unit for child care subsidies under this section.

More importantly, and directly related to your comment that including "the department" seems to go beyond a technical correction, I was trying to parallel the language already used in s. 49.155 (1m). Throughout s.49.155(1m) relating to eligibility, when this term is used, the department (meaning DCF) seems to be always included:

(c) 1. Except as provided in subds. 1g., 1h., 1m., 2., and 3., the gross income of the individual's family is at or below 185% of the poverty line for a family the size of the individual's family or, for an individual who is already receiving a child care subsidy under this section, the gross income of the individual's family is at or below 200% of the poverty line for a family the size of the individual's family. In calculating the gross income of the family, the or county department or agency determining eligibility shall include court-ordered child or family support payments received by the individual, if those support payments exceed \$1,250 per month, and income described under s. 49.145 (3) (b) 1. and 3., except that, in calculating farm and self-employment income, the department or county department or agency determining eligibility shall include the sum of the following:

1g. If the individual is a foster parent of the child or a subsidized guardian or interim caretaker of the child under s. 48.623, the child's biological or adoptive family has a gross income that is at or below 200% of the poverty line. In calculating the gross income of the child's biological or adoptive family, or county department or agency determining eligibility shall include court-ordered child or family

1h. If the individual is a relative of the child, is providing care for the child under a court order, and is receiving payments under s. 48.57 (3m) or (3n) on behalf of the child, the child's biological or adoptive family has a gross income that is at or below 200% of the poverty line. In calculating the gross income of the child's biological or adoptive family, see the or county department or agency determining eligibility shall include

It was not our intent to go beyond a technical correction. I think it is fine the way you have drafted it, but it is not consistent with the rest of the references in (1m) and I am concerned you think it might not be "technical".



Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, except in Milwaukee County, the Department of Children and Families (DCF) is required to contract with a county department, the Milwaukee County enrollment services unit (services unit), a Wisconsin Works agency, a child care resource and referral agency, or another agency to determine the eligibility of individuals for child care subsidies under Wisconsin Shares in a particular geographic region or for a particular Indian tribal unit, and in Milwaukee County DCF may contract with the services unit to determine eligibility. Under former law, Wisconsin Works agencies determined eligibility.

The statutes currently provide that an individual may be eligible for Wisconsin Shares if the Wisconsin Works agency determines that basic education or a course of study at a technical college would facilitate the individual's efforts to maintain employment and the individual needs child care services to participate in basic education or the course of study. Note: Removes a reference to appointing a guardian ad litem for a minor party in an action to establish child custody and placement for a father who has acknowledged paternity because a minor may not acknowledge paternity under current law.
