Hi Aaron,

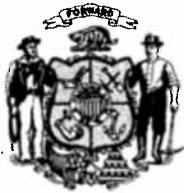
Our office would like to request a preliminary bill draft dealing with the treatment of vehicles that have collector registration plates. Senator Petrowski would like to allow vehicles manufactured before 1979 that have collector registration plates to be treated under the same criteria as cars that have antique registration plates (i.e. allow for the DOT issued plates to be carried inside of the vehicle, etc.). He wants to give vehicles with collector registration plates this exemption only when they're being driven to and from car shows or parades.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law provides for a special category of vehicle registration for special interest vehicles, commonly known as "collector vehicles." A vehicle may be eligible for registration as a collector vehicle if the vehicle is at least 20 years old, has not been altered, and is being preserved for its historic interest, or if the vehicle is, with an exception, at least 25 years old and is a certain type of former military vehicle. Vehicles registered as collector vehicles are issued two distinctive registration plates, commonly known as "collector plates," that identify the vehicle as a collector vehicle and that display the vehicle owner's collector identification number. A collector vehicle may be reregistered for no additional fee if, with an exception, the vehicle is not operated on the highways during the month of January.

Also under current law, an owner of a motor vehicle that is of model year 1945 or earlier may register the vehicle as an antique vehicle. Antique vehicles may be driven only for special occasions such as display and parade purposes or for necessary testing, maintenance, and storage purposes. Antique vehicles may display a historical registration plate from or representing the model year of the vehicle but must carry current registration plates in the vehicle.

This bill allows the display, on collector vehicles manufactured before 1979, of historical registration plates from or representing the model year of the vehicle if:

As of this morning, here's where we stand with the plate suggestion:

If a person possesses at least one historical plate, they are required to display one plate on the back of the vehicle, but if they have two historical plates, they are allowed – not required – to display both. If a person chooses to only display one plate, they can still operate on the road as long as the registration and plates issued by the DOT are carried inside the vehicle.

Would this be workable?

Hi Dan,

I'm not sure where we are with this one. One possibility is for me to make par. (dm) on p. 2, line 14 into (dm) 1. and add a new 2. that reads as follows:

2. If a person possesses 2 historical plates described in subd. 1., the person shall display both historical plates on the special interest vehicle as provided in subd. 1. If a person possesses only one historical plate described in subd. 1., the person shall display the historical plate on the rear of the special interest vehicle and display a plate issued by the department under par. (c) on the front of the special interest vehicle.

Please let me know if this is consistent with your intent, and if not, how you would like to proceed.

Tim,

Thanks for sharing this draft with us prior to introduction.

In short, the proposal will have no fiscal or administrative impact on DOT.

This proposal is similar to the allowance of historical plates for Antique plates, but with a few restrictions. The provision relating to the manufactured date of 1979 or older results in only a certain segment of Collector vehicles being able to qualify, and only if the vehicle is being operated to or from a car show or parade.

We have one question needing clarification in regards to the interpretation of Section 3 (*page 2, line 13*). It is unclear if the intention is to allow the display of a single historical plate, as suggested by the language (*page 2, line 14*) "Notwithstanding s. 341.15(1)". The bill refers to "historical plates" (plural) in Section 3, but "historic plate" (singular) in Section 2, regarding Antique plates. Any clarification you can provide on this would be helpful.

If this bill was to become current law, all we would need to do is update the Department's website and educate our special plate staff. Officially, the Department has no position on such proposal. Law enforcement may have an opinion, as the bill does not stipulate the condition or legibility of the plate, and the historical plate number will not be recorded on the DMV motor vehicle system. Law enforcement must run the Collector plate license number (probably kept in the glove box), to view the record.

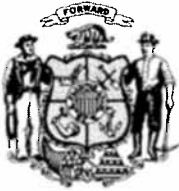

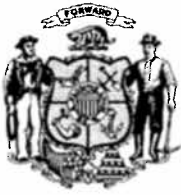
