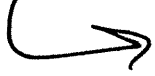

PROPOSAL FOR LEGISLATIVE ACTION

**Date:** February 8, 2013

**Working Title of Act:** Fair Licensing Fees for New Food Businesses

**Statute Sections affected by action:** Dairy plants, s. 97.20, Wis. Stats.; Food warehouses, s. 97.27, Wis. Stats.; Food processing plants, s. 97.29, Wis. Stats.; Retail food establishments, s. 97.30, Wis. Stats.; and Compulsory inspection of animals, poultry and carcasses, s. 97.42, Wis. Stats.

**Description of action, i.e. create new section; amend existing section, repeal and recreate existing section:** Amend ss. 97.20(2)(a), 97.27(2), 97.29(2)(a), 97.30(2)(a), and 97.42(2)(a), Wis. Stats.

**Plain-language description of what action does:** This statutory change would extend the licensing period from one year to up to 15 months for new food processing plants, dairy plants, retail food establishments, food warehouses, and meat establishments receiving an initial food license within three months prior to the license's annual expiration date. Each food-related license administered by Wisconsin's Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) expires annually on a specified date. For example, all food processing plant licenses expire on March 31<sup>st</sup> each year and all retail food establishment licenses expire on June 30<sup>th</sup>.

Maintaining a single expiration date for each license type simplifies the licensing renewal process and minimizes licensing administration costs. New owners of food-related businesses must pay the full annual license fee when they apply for a new license and then must renew the license and pay the annual fee for the following year's license on the expiration date. License fees are not prorated for establishments that are in business for a partial year. Business owners that apply for a new license for a food establishment shortly before the license expiration date are responsible for paying the total, non-prorated annual fee for the remaining portion of the year they establish the business, as well as the renewal fee once the license expires. If adopted, this proposal would create a statutory requirement that new licenses issued within three months of a license expiration date will be valid until the expiration date of the following year, for a maximum of 15 months beginning on the date a license is issued. This would be a one-time exemption for new licenses only.

**Relationship of this action to any relevant federal laws or regulations:** There is no relationship to federal laws and regulations. Food processing plants, dairy plants, food warehouses, and state-inspected meat and poultry plants are licensed by the state. Retail food establishments are licensed at either the state or local level. Food processing plants, dairy plants, and food warehouses are required to register as food facilities with the US Food and Drug Administration, but there is no fee associated with this registration.

**Fiscal effect on WDATCP:** This action will result in a small decrease in fee revenue which will be offset by a slight reduction in administrative time spent on processing license renewals. We anticipate 50 - 100 new licenses each year would benefit from this fee change.

## Statutory changes:

Sections 97.20(2)(a), 97.27(2), 97.29(2)(a), 97.30(2)(a), and 97.42(2)(a), Wis. Stats. would be amended as follows:

### **97.20(2)** DAIRY PLANT LICENSE.

(a)*License requirement.* Except as provided in par. (e), no person, including this state, may operate a dairy plant without a valid license issued by the department for that dairy plant. A dairy plant license expires on April 30 annually and is not transferable between persons or locations. A new license issued on or after January 30th will expire on April 30th of the following year.

**97.27(2)** LICENSE REQUIRED. No person may operate a food warehouse without a valid license issued by the department for the food warehouse. A food warehouse license expires on June 30 annually. A new license issued on or after March 30th will expire on June 30th of the following year. Every food warehouse shall have a separate license. A license is not transferable between persons or food warehouse locations. Application for a license shall be made on a form provided by the department and shall be accompanied by applicable fees required under sub. (3). An application shall include information reasonably required by the department for licensing purposes.

### **97.29(2)** LICENSE.

(a)*Requirement.* Except as provided under par. (b), no person may operate a food processing plant without a valid license issued by the department for that food processing plant. A license expires on March 31 annually. A new license issued on or after January 1st will expire on March 31<sup>st</sup> of the following year. Each food processing plant shall have a separate license. A license is not transferable between persons or locations. Application for a license shall be made on a form provided by the department and be accompanied by the applicable fees required under sub. (3). An applicant shall identify the categories of food processing activities which the applicant proposes to conduct at the food processing plant. An application shall include additional information which may reasonably be required by the department for licensing purposes.

### **97.30(2)** LICENSE.

(a)*Requirement.* Except as provided under par. (b), no person may operate a retail food establishment without a valid license issued by the department or an agent city or county. Licenses expire on June 30 annually. A new license issued on or after March 30<sup>th</sup> will expire on June 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year. Each retail food establishment shall have a separate license. A license is not transferable between persons or establishments. Application for a license shall be made on a form provided by the department, or by the agent city or county, and be accompanied by the applicable fees required under sub. (3) or s. 97.41. An application shall indicate whether food processing is conducted at the establishment and shall specify the nature of any food processing activities. An application shall include other information reasonably required by the department, or by the agent city or county, for licensing purposes.

### **97.42(2)** LICENSE; CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION.

(a) No person may operate an establishment as defined in sub. (1) (d) without a valid license issued by the department for each such establishment. That license expires on June 30 annually. A new license issued on or after March 30<sup>th</sup> will expire on June 30<sup>th</sup> of the following year. No license may be issued unless the applicant has complied with the requirements of this section. The annual license fee is \$200,

except the annual license fee shall be \$80 for those establishments engaged only in slaughtering uninspected animals or poultry or processing uninspected meat as a custom service, and not in other operations subject to a license under this section. No person may be required to obtain a license under s. 97.29 or 97.30 for activities licensed under this section or which is inspected under 21 USC 451 to 695.
