## Tim Fiocchi:

As requested, this draft requires a person who sells a lead acid battery of the type described to charge a \$10 deposit. Because there will almost certainly be inflation over time, in the future \$10 will be worth less than it is today and the value of the lead (and any other components that have value) in a battery is likely to increase. You might want to consider allowing a seller to charge a higher deposit to ensure that batteries continue to be returned in the future.
