### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Current law addresses the procedure to follow for involuntary commitments. This bill, if enacted, would provide a procedure for the corporation counsel to make a limited appearance in certain involuntary commitment proceedings.

Prosecutors are not involved in mental health commitment proceedings except for "Not Guilty due to Insanity" findings, which aren't affected by this bill. Consequently, there is no fiscal impact on District Attorney offices should this bill be enacted.

### **Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

Prosecutors do not expect any long-term fiscal impact on their offices should this bill be enacted.
