Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill expands the definition of domestic abuse to include stalking, or a threat to stalk, as well as other provisions affect the court processes for the issuance of a temporary restraining order or injunction, including those for child abuse cases. There is no state fiscal effect on the appropriations managed by the Department of Children and Families.

However, local costs could increase at the county level based on provisions of the bill that remove certain persons from being billed for guardian ad litem costs in child abuse cases involving temporary restraining orders or injunctions. The potential fiscal effect of these provisions cannot be determined.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
