Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, the Law Enforcement Standards Board (LESB) is attached to the Department of Justice (DOJ) and DOJ shall supply the staffing needs of the LESB.

Under 2013 Assembly Bill 482, the LESB is directed to establish program outcomes for a law enforcement training program which includes a greater number of training hours than what is currently required. Specifics of the training program shall be established by written policy of the board.

Since DOJ is required to supply the staffing needs of the LESB, DOJ will incur costs assisting the LESB with its responsibilities under AB 482. DOJ anticipates having to facilitate the LESB's efforts to develop curriculum, competencies, objectives, and the number of hours devoted to each subject.

DOJ anticipates that it will be able to absorb its costs associated with staffing the LESB.
