Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill will allow a person, who has been ordered to prison for failure to pay a monetary judgment ordered by a municipal court, to be imprisoned in a bordering county within or outside the State in certain circumstances.

Prosecutors believe this will impact county and municipal budgets, but not District Attorney (DA) offices; so, they do not believe there will be any fiscal impact on DA offices should this bill be enacted.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Prosecutors do not envision that this bill, if enacted, will have a long-term fiscal impact on District Attorney offices.
