Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill provides immunity from civil and criminal liability to any employee or agent of, or contractor with a municipality, in which a property in foreclosure action is located or utility company that provides service to the property and to a plaintiff in a foreclosure action, for acts or omissions related to, going on and inspecting, the property and taking any actions necessary to preserve or protect the property or public health and safety.

There is no way to predict the number of offenders that would be impacted by this bill. The Department may have fewer offenders placed on probation as a result of this proposed legislation. The average FY13 cost to supervise an offender is approximately \$2,700.

Additionally, since the Department of Corrections has no way to determine how this legislation would impact, local criminal and civil arrests within the state it not possible to estimate the fiscal impact to county or municipal jails.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications
