Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

BILL SUMMARY

Currently under Wisconsin law, a first offense operating while intoxicated conviction (0.08 or greater) is a civil offense and the fine amount is not less than \$150 or more than \$300. A second offense is a crime and has a fine range from \$350 - \$1,100, and includes imprisonment of not less than five days or more than six months.

This bill increases penalties for a first offense OWI where the alcohol concentration was 0.15 or greater, to a forfeiture no less than \$500 or greater than \$1,100, and imprisonment of not less than five days or more than six months. A second offense OWI is subject to a forfeiture no less than \$500 or more than \$1,500, and imprisonment of not less than 10 days or more than six months.
