Description Alerts for missing adults at risk and making an appropriation					

Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, DOJ administers an integrated crime alert network to provide information regarding known and suspected criminal activity, crime prevention, and missing or endangered persons. 2013 Assembly Bill 710 creates s. 175.51, specifying law enforcement agencies may use DOJ's existing Crime Alert Network to disseminate reports of missing adults at risk to certain broadcasters and outdoor advertisers.

The bill requires DOJ to: 1) solicit input from organizations with missions focused on individuals who are at least 65 years of age to determine guidelines for disseminating reports of adults at risk; 2) train law enforcement officers on identifying reports of adults at risk; 3) facilitate law enforcement agency access to the crime alert network for the purpose of disseminating reports of adults at risk; and 4) maintain a list of broadcasters and outdoor advertisers that have agreed to be on the list and that would be appropriate recipients of reports of adults at risk.

The bill increases the DOJ appropriation under s. 20.455(2)(a) by \$64,500 in fiscal year 2015 to increase the authorized FTE positions by 1.0 GPR position to perform the duties associated with reports of missing adults at risk.
