Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill increases state equalization aids to school districts in the 2014-15 school year by \$396,000,000.

State:

This bill increases state equalization aids to school districts in the 2014-15 school year by \$396,000,000.

Local:

This bill increases state equalization aids to school districts in the 2014–15 school year by \$396,000,000. The exact amount each school district would recieve is dependent on the school aid formula. However, school district revenue limits are not changed. Thus, any increase in general aid received by a district will be offset by a reduction in property tax levy limit authority.

It is unknown how many school districts plan to levy the full amount possible under the revenue limit and how many plan to levy less than the full amount. It is also unknown if school districts who plan to levy less than the full amount will decrease their levy by the amount of the increase in school aid or levy the full amount possible.

The fiscal effect on school districts is a potential \$396,000,000 reduction in property tax levies.
