Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2013 SB 574 makes changes to the provisions allowing for the operating of vehicles in excess of weight limits on roads during energy emergencies. Currently, these provisions generally apply to vehicles having a gross weight of 50,000 pounds or more. SB 574 would provide for the waiver of road weight limits for vehicles having a gross weight of 26,000 pounds or less. Transportation over the state's roads is regulated by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (DOT). Current provisions and SB 574 require that DOT consult with DOA prior to waiving the road weight restrictions/requirements during an energy emergency.

Currently, the Department administers a crisis energy assistance program and other energy-related assistance programs. The Department develops policies and programs related to energy resources. The Department also assists the Governor's Office in determining and declaring an energy emergency for non-regulated resources (e.g., propane), and is involved in coordinating the response to these energy emergencies. The Department estimates that it is involved in two to three annual energy emergencies.

The Department anticipates that the workload associated with consulting with the DOT would be provided for with current resources and would result in no additional costs to the Department.
