Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill repeals a prohibition against making certain records for events that occurred before October 1, 1907, available in electronic format, and allows any person to copy or make available electronically an uncertified copy of a vital record for an event occurring prior to October 1, 1907.

Should this bill be enacted, District Attorneys do not anticipate any fiscal impact on their offices.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

District Attorneys do not expect there to be a long-term fiscal effect on their offices should this bill be enacted.
