2013 Assembly Bill 824

Assembly Amendment 1

Under current law, no person may park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle upon any portion of a street, highway, or parking facility reserved for vehicles displaying special registration plates or a special identification card designating the vehicle as a vehicle used by a physically disabled person. Current law also prohibits a person from obstructing, blocking, or otherwise limiting the use of any space or access aisle reserved for the use physically disabled persons.

Under **2013 Assembly Bill 824**, a disabled parking space violation may be enforced by a person who is employed by a city, village, or town and is designated by that city, village, or town to enforce disabled parking space violations. Under **Assembly Amendment 1** to Assembly Bill 824, a disabled parking space violation may be enforced by a person who is employed by a county and is designated by that county to enforce disabled parking space violations.

Bill History

Representative Ripp offered Assembly Amendment 1 to Assembly Bill 824 on March 7, 2014. On March 11, 2014, the Assembly Committee on Transportation voted to recommend adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 and passage of Assembly Bill 824, as amended, both on votes of Ayes, 14; Noes, 0.
