AN ACT *unpasteurized* relating to: the sale of unpasteurized milk and milk products.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill allows a dairy farmer to sell unpasteurized (~~commonly called~~ raw) milk and raw milk products directly to consumers on the dairy farmer's farm.

Current law generally prohibits the sale of raw milk and raw milk products and prohibits the sale to consumers of milk or fluid milk products that are not grade A milk or fluid milk products. Current law requires a dairy farmer to have a milk producer license from the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) and comply with rules promulgated by DATCP relating to the operation of dairy farms and the testing and quality of milk.

Under this bill, a dairy farmer may sell raw milk and raw milk products such as butter and cheese directly to consumers on the farm where the milk and milk products are produced. A dairy farmer selling such products must comply with the same licensing requirements and DATCP rules as other dairy farmers selling milk and milk products.

This bill also exempts certain dairy farmers from licensing requirements under current law. Current law requires a dairy farmer to have a milk producer license from the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) and requires a facility that processes or manufactures dairy products such as butter or cheese to have a dairy plant license from DATCP. Current law also requires a facility engaging in food processing to have a food processing license from DATCP, but provides an exception for dairy plants that have a dairy plant license. Under the bill, these DATCP rules do not apply to raw milk or raw milk products sold directly to consumers on the farm or to the operation of a dairy farm or dairy plant that does not sell or distribute milk or milk products other than raw milk or raw milk products.

17 (b) A milk producer may sell unpasteurized milk and unpasteurized milk
18 products directly to a consumer on the milk producer’s dairy farm where the milk and
19 milk products are produced.

4 97.29 (1) (g) 1m. Activities at a dairy farm that is not required to have a dairy
5 plant license under s. 97.20 (2) (e) 1.
