We would like a draft on Non-Emergency Medical Transport based on a modification of the language inserted by JFC into the budget, but vetoed by the Governor.

Here is what we are looking for:

Require DHS to modify the current contract for the arrangement and reimbursement of nonemergency medical transportation services for medical assistance beneficiaries, to the extent permitted by that contract, to exclude <u>Buffalo</u>, <u>Eau Claire</u>, Jefferson, Kenosha, Milwaukee, Ozaukee, <u>Peppin</u>, Racine, <u>Rock</u>, <u>Trempealeau</u>, Walworth, Washington, and Waukesha county MA beneficiaries from the contract and make alternative arrangements for the provision of nonemergency medical transportation services for beneficiaries in those counties. Specify that alternative arrangements may be made with counties, health maintenance organizations, or transportation providers. Change would apply to the contract in effect on the effective date of the bill and would take effect no later than January 1, 2017.





Tamara,

We'd like to request 3 changes to this bill draft:

- 1. Allow counties to opt out of the bill's provisions. If the county takes action they could choose to remain under the state's MTM NEMT contract.
- 2. Require the new NEMT services developed under the bill in these counties to have similar requirements for tracking rider/use data similar to those required under the current state contract. This allows the two program approaches to be compared.
- 3. Require that by February 1, 2019 the Legislative Audit Bureau conduct an audit of the new program and the current MTM/NEMT program.
