Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires that, when the Department of Children and Families pays a child care subsidy for child care services under the Wisconsin Works program, commonly called Wisconsin Shares, and those services are provided to a program participant by the Young Men's Christian Association or the Boys and Girls Clubs of America, DCF must pay or reimburse those organizations directly, rather than issuing the benefits to the program participant. Under current law, DCF may choose whether benefits are paid to the program participant or the child care provider. ✓

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

4 of Wisconsin Works participants and applicants or that the Wisconsin Works agency
5 arranges to meet immediate, short-term child care needs of participants prior to
6 authorization of a subsidy under sub. (1m).

Sandy:

I'm afraid I don't have the answer to your question. All I can tell you is that, under current law, the agency can choose whether to pay the benefit directly to the child care provider or to issue the benefit to the program participant. Under the bill, the agency must pay the benefit directly to YMCA and Boys and Girls Clubs.

I'm not familiar with the EBT card requirement that is coming. If you want confirmation on this issue, perhaps the agency would be a better resource.

Please let me know if you want me to jacket the proposal or hold off for now.
