Danielle:

As we discussed, this would repeal the compact provisions and reverse all associated changes made in the bill, effective four years after the bill's effective date. According to the compact, withdrawal from the compact would then occur one year after the date of the repeal. Any subsequent enactment of the legislature could, of course, cancel that scheduled repeal before it ever occurred or change the date of the scheduled repeal.

Also, regarding the report, note that under the bill, the report is due every January 1 and is not tied to a fiscal year. So I just required it to include copies of all rules promulgated or changes made since the last report. Will that work? Another approach would be to instead (or in addition) require copies of all rules then in effect.
