Under current law, the limit on the total number of pupils residing in a school district who may participate in the statewide parental choice program (pupil participation limit) in the 2015–16 and 2016–17 school years is one percent of the school district's membership in the previous school year. Beginning with the 2017–18 school year, the pupil participation limit increases one percentage point each year until the limit reaches ten percent in the 2025–26 school year, after which there is no pupil participation limit in the statewide parental choice program.

This bill creates an exception to the pupil participation limit. The exception allows a pupil who attended a private school under the statewide or Racine parental choice program in the previous year to attend a private school under the statewide parental choice program if the pupil's application to attend a private school under the statewide parental choice program is not accepted because the pupil's resident school district exceeded the school district's pupil participation limit.
